The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) XII, through the Local Government Capability Development Division (LGCDD), conducted the EODB Compliance Audit for CY 2023 to the City of Tacurong, Sultan Kudarat, City of Koronadal, South Cotabato, City of Kidapawan, Cotabato, and General Santos City on October 25-27, 2023.

The activity aims to determine the performance of LGUs' compliance with RA 11032 and other related issuances by the DILG and other national government agencies. It was conducted on-site and actual simulation of frontline services, interview of Committee on Anti-Red Tape (CART) members and concerned key LGU Personnel from the Business Permit and Licensing Office (BPLO), City Treasurer, Office of the Building Official (OBO), City Economic Development Officer (CEDO), as well as the Local Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) were meticulously undertaken by the audit team.



The said audit was participated by the Department's partner agencies from Anti-Red Tape Authority (ARTA) Eastern Mindanao Regional Office, Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) XII and Mainland BARMM, and Bureau of Local Government Finance (BLGF) XII as part of the DILG EODB Audit Team.

The result that will be generated from this assessment will be used by the four cities or as benchmarking in identifying Capdev along with the identified Capacity Development Trainings on Regulatory Impact Assessment, Reengineering Plan, and Energy Virtual One-Stop-Shop to help them comply with the EODB law.

To bolster the nation's disaster response capabilities, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) XII recently spearheaded a vital training program on the Management of the Dead and Missing Persons (MDM). Held in collaboration with the Local Government Academy from November 27 to 30,2023, at the Greenleaf Hotel in General Santos City, the initiative aimed to equip select local government units and stakeholders in Region 12 with essential skills and knowledge crucial for effectively handling the aftermath of emergencies and disasters.

The MDM Cluster is vital in the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management System (PDRRMS). As a critical component of the National Disaster Response Plan (NDRP) clusters, it operates within the Incident Management System (ICS). Recognizing its significance, the DILG, the cluster's lead convenor, orchestrated this training program to provide comprehensive insights into MDM's policies, guidelines, systems, and mechanisms, emphasizing their practical application.

Over four intensive days, 54 participants from various local government units composed of LDRRMOs, MLGOOs, Chiefs of Police, LSWDOs, Fire Marshalls, and the Philippine Coast Guard came together at the Greenleaf Hotel. The training fostered a collaborative environment for shared learning and skill development, guided by a carefully curated module presented by national MDM instructors from DILG CODIX, the Philippine

Coast Guard, DILG XII, DSWD XII, and the Office of Civil Defense. The participants delved into the intricacies of MDM, gaining hands-on experience in policies, guidelines, mechanisms, systems, and structures.

- 1. Rules and Regulations Governing the Management of the Dead and Missing Persons: Participants understood the overarching policies and guidelines governing MDM, ensuring a thorough grasp of the legal framework in guiding their actions during emergencies.
- 2. Operationalization on the Ground: The training program elucidated how MDM is operationalized in real-world scenarios, providing practical insights into on-the-ground implementation. Broken down into 9 Modules, 7 Activities which consist of MDM structure and facilities, handling and disposition of dead bodies, reporting missing persons, and management of the bereaved families and an intensive simultaneous Simulation Exercise to facilitate the practical application of the learned principles in training.
- 3. Incident Management System (ICS): Emphasis was placed on integrating MDM into the broader Incident Management System, highlighting the interconnectedness of various disaster response components.
- 4. Collaborative Learning: Through interactive workshops, demonstrations, and simulations, participants engaged in cooperative learning exercises, enhancing their ability to work seamlessly as a team during high-stress situations.



The successful completion of the Management of the Dead and Missing Persons training program underscores the Department of the Interior and Local Government's commitment to fortifying the nation's disaster response capabilities. By equipping local government units in Region 12 with the necessary skills and knowledge, the initiative lays the foundation for a more robust and effective response to emergencies and disasters, ultimately safeguarding the wellbeing of communities in the face of adversity.

## OPERATION LISTO ROLLOUT: DILG XII EMPOWERS COMMUNITIES WITH DISASTER PREPAREDNESS MANUALS

The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) XII, in partnership with the Local Government Academy (LGA), is making significant strides in the "Enhancement of Local Government's Capacity on Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) & Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation (CCAM) Program: Operation LISTO." This initiative focuses on crafting disaster preparedness manuals to assist local government units (LGUs) in minimizing the impact of disasters community-level and bolsterina readiness for events like typhoons, weather disturbances, localized volcanic eruptions, tsunamis, and earthquakes.

Central to this program is developing disaster preparedness manuals to guide LGUs in planning implementing and actions to mitigate disaster impacts. This effort contributes to fortifying the institutional capacity of Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) and Offices (LDRRMOs) at the provincial, city, and municipal aligning broader levels. with national programs such as the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (NDRRMP) 2020-2030 and the Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2023-2028.



The training aims to empower LGUs to fully utilize the disaster manuals preparedness and strengthen their respective LGU "LISTO Team," to enhance preparedness within disaster their areas of jurisdiction. The training sessions were structured to include hands-on workshops, providing practical insights into disaster preparedness. The workshops' key components involved reviewing checklists for earlv actions and minimum preparedness critical actions related to earthquakes, localized weather disturbances, tsunamis, and volcanic eruptions. The workshops allowed participants to actively engage with the materials and better understand nuances disaster the of response.

In essence, the collaborative efforts of DILG XII, LGA, and various regional stakeholders seek to empower LGUs the through "Enhancement of Local Government's Capacity on DRRM & CCAM Program: Operation LISTO," promoting community resilience and preparedness for diverse disaster scenarios. The training team is composed of a Regional Pool of Trainers and experts from DILG XII, Office of Civil Defense XII, DOST-PHIVOLCS, and DOST-PAGASA Gensan Weather Station.

The training program concluded on December 14 with an interactive session where LGU participants drafted their respective action plans. These plans aim to address the identified gaps and needs within their respective LGUs,

The resource persons brought a wealth of knowledge and practical insights, ensuring a comprehensive learning experience for the participants. The training management team, additional comprising support members, also played a pivotal role in the smooth facilitation of the event.

Aiming to empower these new leaders as primary agents in effective delivering public South service, the DILG Cotabato has initiated this Orientation to enable the officials to effectively perform their mandated roles and responsibilities, particularly the tasks that thev should accomplish in their first 100 days from assumption to Office. The training also seeks to lay the groundwork for a continuous capacity development framework, firmly anchored in the principles of good governance.



As part also of popularizing the Cotabato sub-LGRRC, South and promoting a culture of knowledge sharing, the sub-LGRRC led by the Public Citizenship Development Facility established a sub-LGRRC booth on the venue, displayed various Knowledge Products (KPs) that the Barangays may need as references.
